The **University of Vienna**, which was founded in 1365, is an internationally orientated university with long term experiences in research and teaching.

Currently, about 90.000 students are enrolled at the university, in more than 178 courses, of which 57 are Bachelor Programmes, 105 Master Programmes, 2 Diploma Programmes and 14 PhD Programmes. With a staff of close to 9.800 employees, 6.800 of which are academic, the University of Vienna is the largest teaching and research institution in Austria.

The main task and goal of this University are creating and sustaining top-quality research and teaching. Research and teaching are regarded as one inseparable entity. A strong focus on research, combining fundamental with application-oriented research, makes this University highly attractive for the sharpest minds.

The University of Vienna has been taking part in the SOKRATES/Erasmus programmes since 1992.
