Staff Exchanges encourage short-term

2. Staff Exchanges Main features



Objectives

International, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary mobility of R&I staff ("secondments")

Knowledge transfer between participating organisations

Collaboration between the academic and nonacademic sectors (including SMEs)

Cooperation across the globe

Eligible participants

Academic sector

Consortium of min. 3 legal entities in 3 different countries, 2 of which in a different EU Member State or HE Associated Country

If organisations from the same sector, there must be at least 1 organisation from a non-associated Third Country*

Non-academic sector

* Secondments within EU MS or HE AC must be between different sectors (between academic and nonacademic), except for interdisciplinary secondments, which must be limited to a maximum of 1/3 of the total implemented months.



Eligible staff



Any type of staff involved in R&I activities (researchers, administrative staff, managerial staff, technical staff) Each staff member is seconded for a period of **1 to 12 months** (may be split into several stays)

Seconded staff members

Researchers at any career stage (from doctoral candidates to postdoctoral researchers)

Actively engaged in research and/or innovation activities for at least **1 month** prior at the sending institution Staff needs to be devoted **full-time** to the action during the secondment

After the secondment, staff should return to their sending institution



Eligible exchanges

"HOSTING" (receiving seconded staff members)



denotes TC partners that are eligible for automatic funding



What does Staff Exchanges fund?





Same-sector secondments in Europe (MS/AC)



≤ 1/3 of the total secondments funded by the EU, if considered Interdisciplinary

Interdisciplinary secondments integrate aspects from two or more different scientific disciplines.

Important: scientific panels + descriptors/first level MSCA keywords from proposal form part A (see <u>REA Website</u>)

In a nutshell...for organisations



Horizon Europe

- Consortium of at least 3 legal entities in 3 different countries, 2 of which in a different MS/AC
- Maximum of 360 person-months per network
 "NEW"
- Interdisciplinary secondments 1/3 of total eligible secondments "NEW"



- Consortium of at least 3 legal entities in 3 different countries, 2 of which in a different MS/AC
- Maximum of **540** person-months per network

Secondments must always take place between **different countries** and between legal entities **independent** from each other



In a nutshell...for researchers





H2020

- Be considered "**staff**" of the sending organisation.
- Be actively engaged in or linked to R&I activities at the sending institution
- Have the appropriate R&I experience
- Return to the sending institution
- Secondment min. 1 month independent to which institution (split stay allowed) "NEW"

- Be considered "**staff**" of the sending organisation.
- Be actively engaged in or linked to R&I activities at the sending institution
- Have the appropriate R&I experience
- Return to the sending institution
- Secondment min. 1 month to the same hosting institution (split stay allowed)

Researchers are seconded for minimum 1 and maximum 12 months.

Gender Equality Plan: Eligibility Criterion

Gender Equality Plan (applicable from 2022 onwards)



Participants that are **public bodies**, **research organisations** or **higher education institutions*** established in a Member State or Associated Country **must have a gender equality plan** in place, fulfilling **mandatory processrelated requirements**.

* Private-for-profit entities (incl. SMEs), NGOs, CSOs, as well any type of organisations from non-associated third countries, are exempted for the criterion See legal categories definitions in the Funding & Tenders Portal <u>here</u>


Mandatory GEP process requirements



Public document

- Formal document
- Signed by top management
- Published on the institution's website
- Disseminated through institution



Dedicated resources

- Funding for gender equality positions or teams
- Reserved time for others to work on gender equality



Data collection and monitoring

- Data on sex or gender of staff across roles and leadership
- Annual reports and evaluation of progress and outcomes



Training and capacity building

- Whole organisation engagement
- Tackle gender

Get a second opinion Have your proposal proof- read by a colleague and pre-screened by your NCP	Sustainability of collaboration Describe the benefits of cooperation and how they can go beyond this project	Contact your National Contact Point (NCP)

Excellence and Implementation are closely interlinked!



Ex-aequo proposals

The priority order:

- 1. Scores they have been awarded for the criterion 'Excellence'.
- 2. When these scores are equal, priority will be based on scores for the criterion 'Impact'.
- 3. If a distinction still cannot be made, the panel may decide to further prioritise by considering other factors such as:
 - gender and other diversity aspects in the research activities,
 - participation of the non-academic sector (including involvement of SMEs),
 - geographical diversity,
 - international cooperation,
 - favorable working/secondment conditions or relationship to the Horizon Europe objectives in general.



Evaluation of proposals and Open Science

"Excellence" criterion



"Quality of implementation" criterion

- Up to 1 page to describe OS practices + up to 1 page to describe research data/output management
- Evaluation of the quality of open science practices

- Explain expertise on OS (if no OS practices are involved then no expertise required)
- List publications, software, data, etc, relevant to the project with qualitative assessment (part B2)
- Publications expected to be open access; datasets expected to be FAIR and 'as open as possible, as closed as necessary'.
