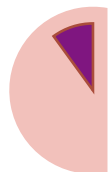

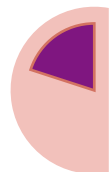

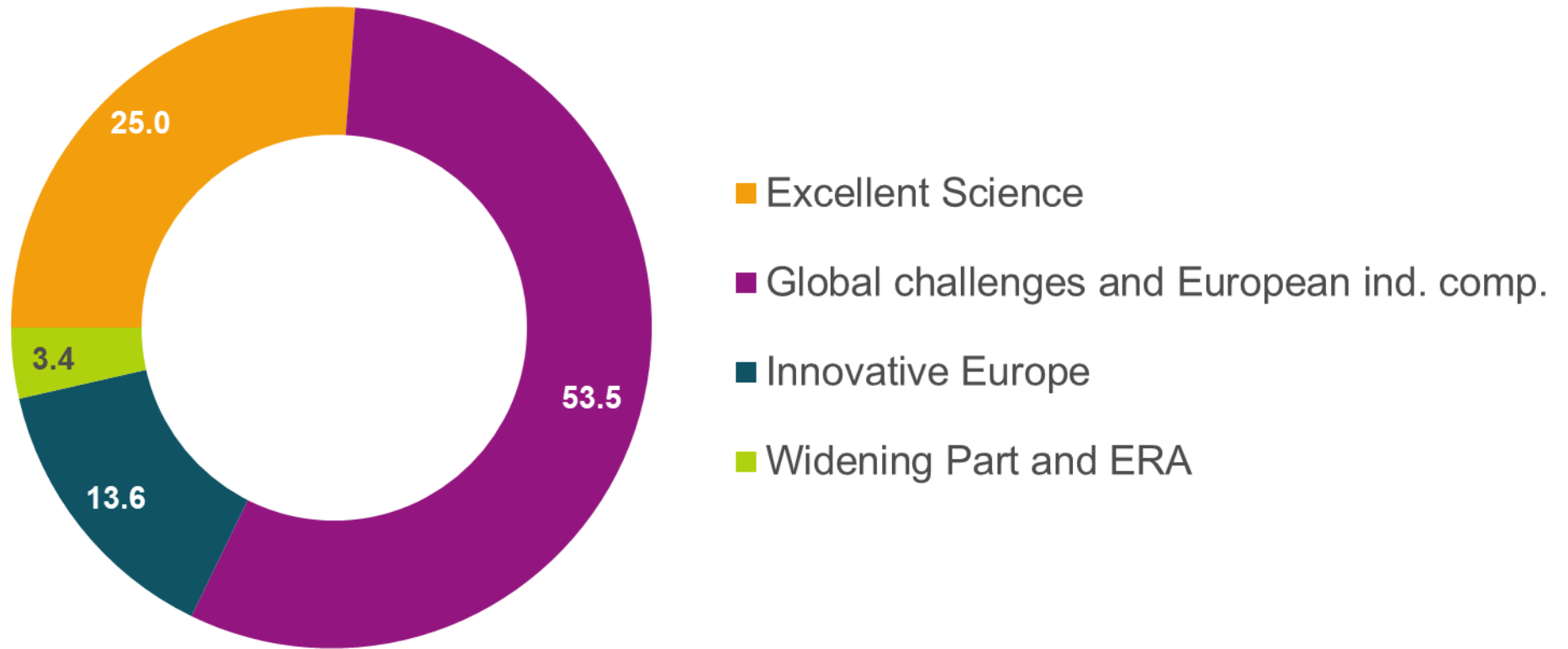

The MSCA have **5** main actions

Doctoral Networks

implement doctoral programmes (including joint doctorates and industrial doctorates) **by international partnerships** of organisations from different sectors. They train highly-skilled doctoral candidates, stimulate their creativity, enhance their innovation capacities and boost their employability in the long-term.

Postdoctoral Fellowships

support researchers' careers and foster excellence in research and innovation. Researchers holding a PhD can carry out their research activities, acquire new skills and develop their careers abroad, whilst developing competences in non-academic sectors and working within interdisciplinary teams.

Staff Exchanges

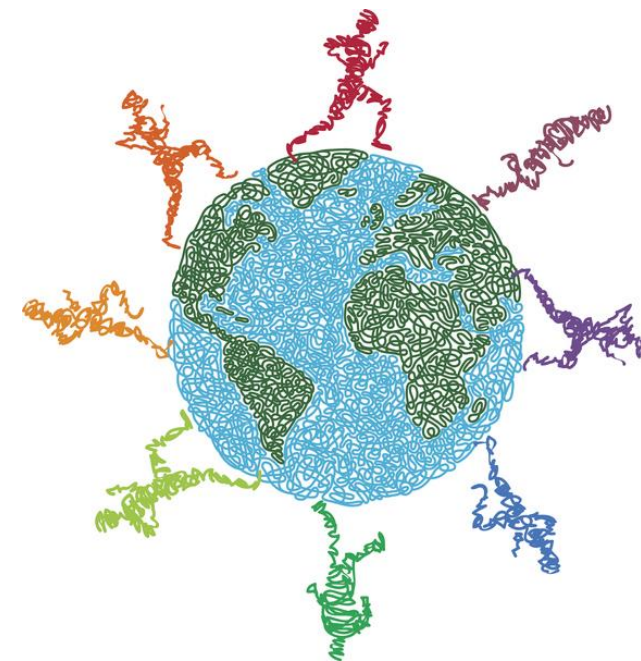
encourage short-term international and inter-sectoral exchanges of research and innovation staff through sustainable, collaborative projects in Europe and beyond. By doing so, they enhance knowledge and skills transfer and increase organisations' research and innovation capacities.

MSCA and Citizens

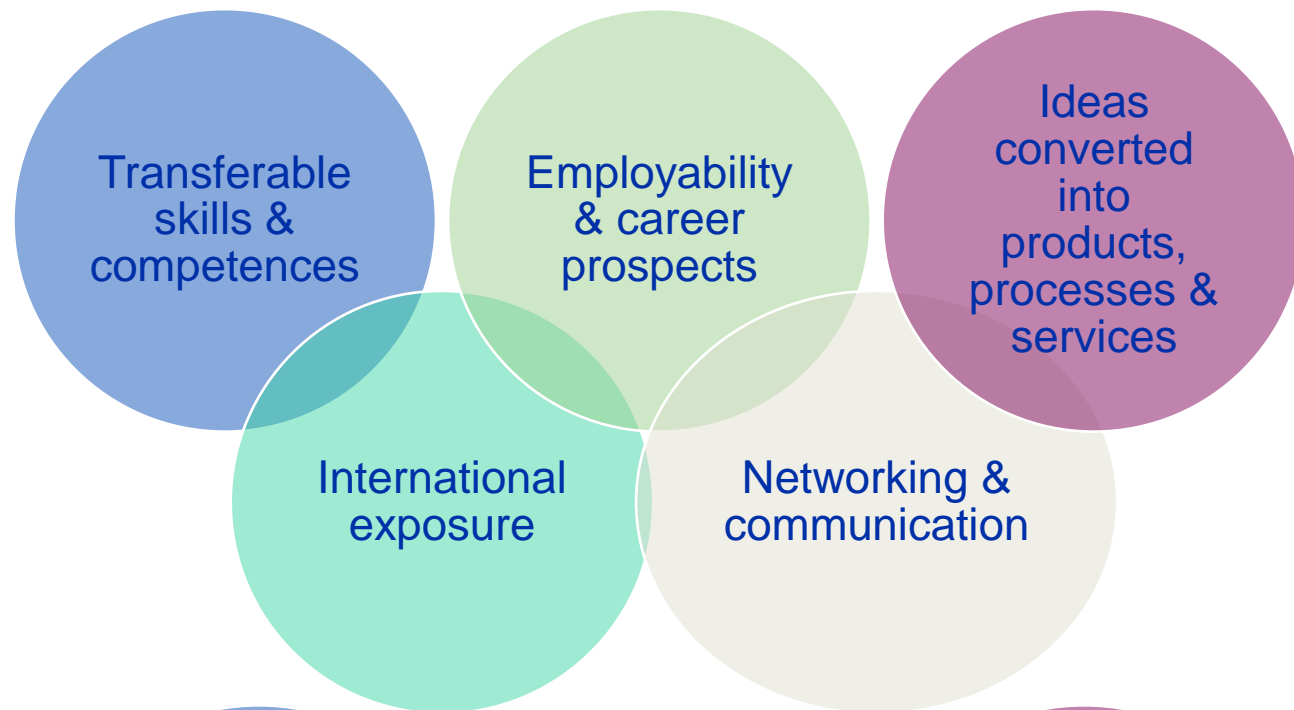

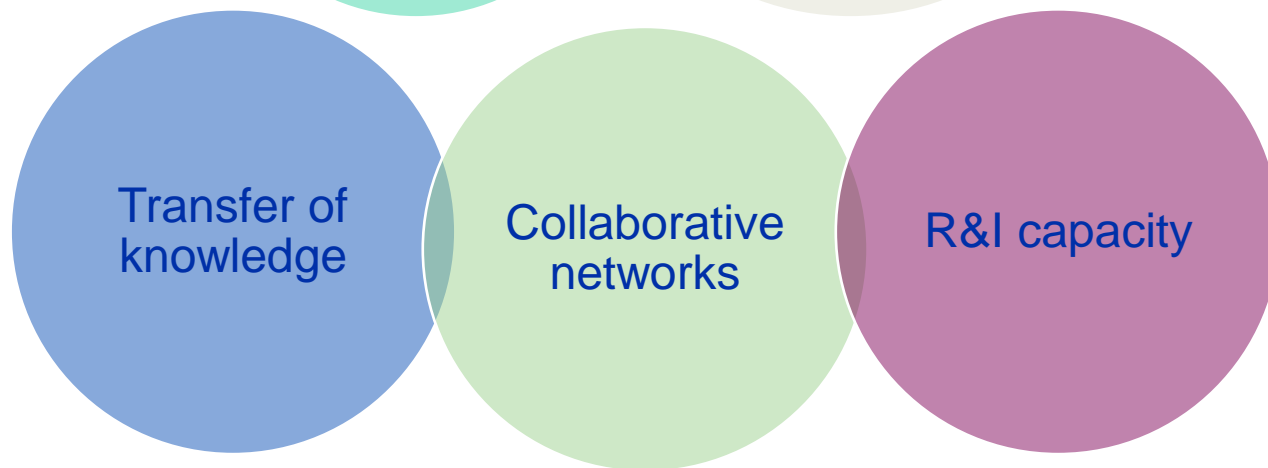

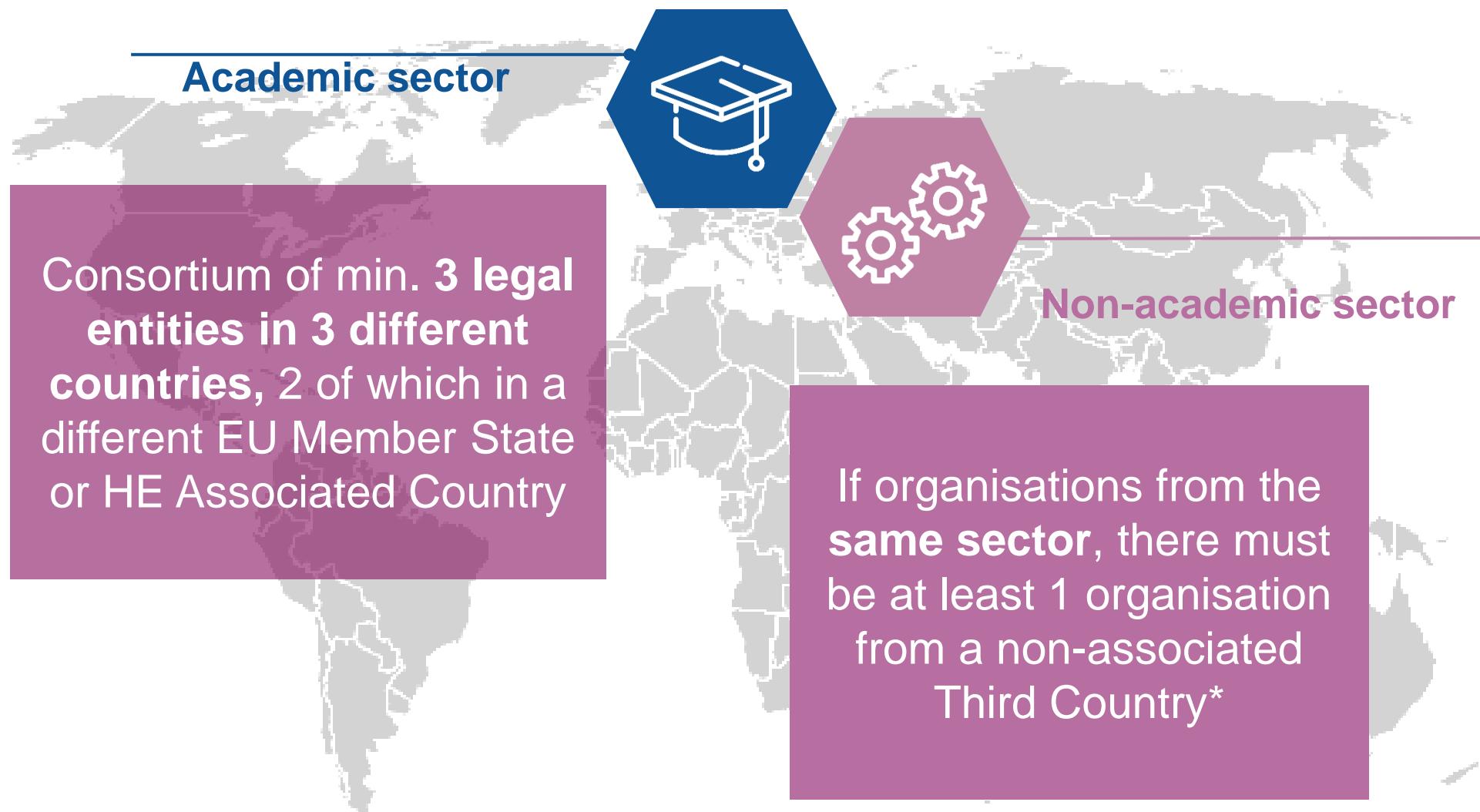

* Secondments within EU MS or HE AC must be between different sectors (between academic and non-academic), except for interdisciplinary secondments, which must be limited to a maximum of 1/3 of the total implemented months.

Eligible staff



Seconded staff members



Any type of staff involved in R&I activities (researchers, administrative staff, managerial staff, technical staff)

Researchers at any career stage (from doctoral candidates to postdoctoral researchers)

Actively engaged in research and/or innovation activities for at least **1 month** prior at the sending institution

Each staff member is seconded for a period of **1 to 12 months** (may be split into several stays)

Staff needs to be devoted **full-time** to the action during the secondment

After the secondment, staff should **return to their sending institution**

Interdisciplinary secondments integrate aspects from two or more different scientific disciplines.

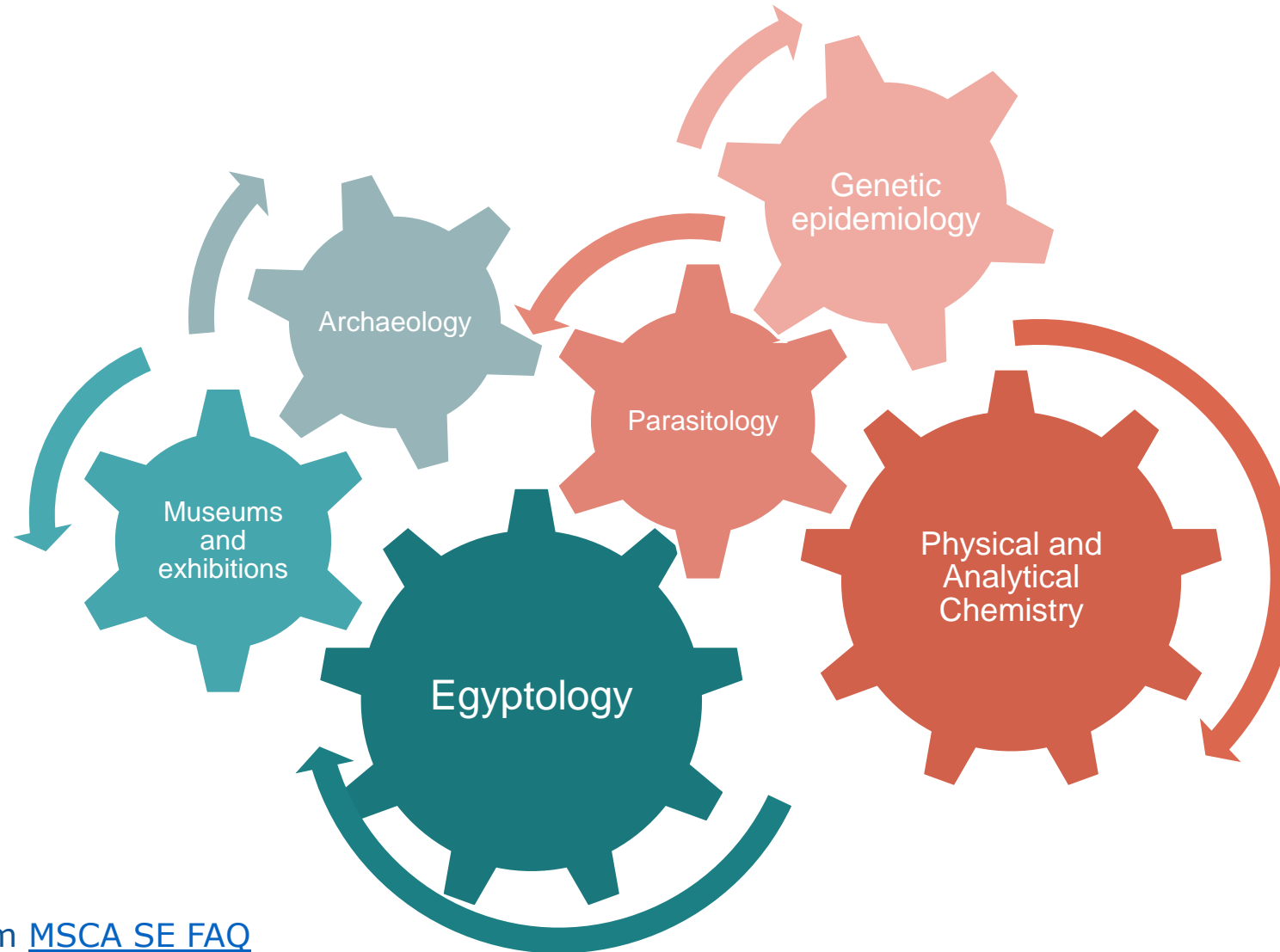

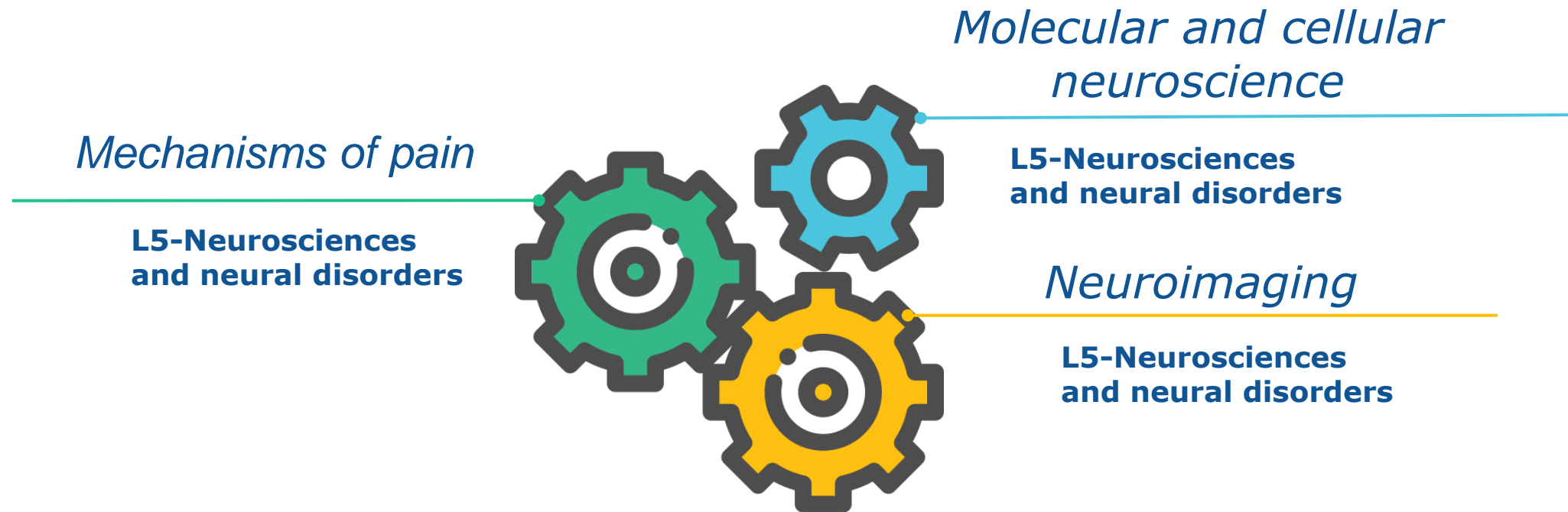

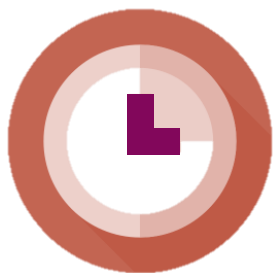

In a nutshell...for organisations

Horizon Europe



H2020

- Consortium of at least 3 legal entities in 3 different countries, 2 of which in a different MS/AC
- Maximum of **360** person-months per network
“**NEW**”
- **Interdisciplinary** secondments 1/3 of total eligible secondments “**NEW**”

- Consortium of at least 3 legal entities in 3 different countries, 2 of which in a different MS/AC
- Maximum of **540** person-months per network

*Secondments must always take place between **different countries** and between legal entities **independent** from each other*

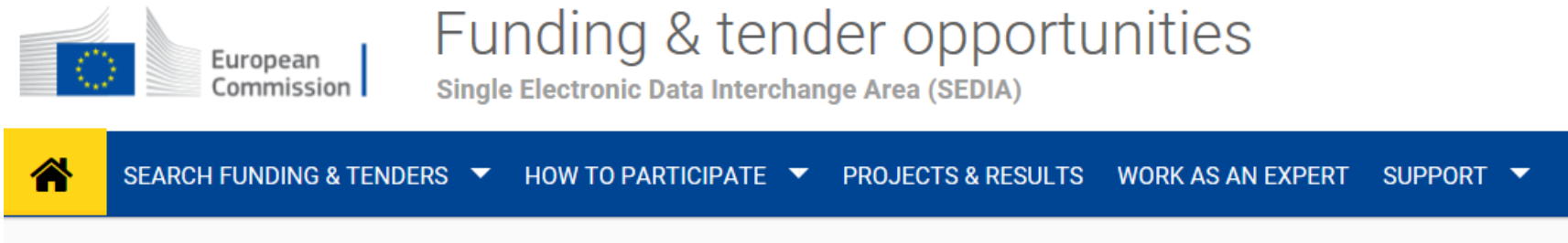
- Be considered “**staff**” of the sending organisation.
 - Be actively engaged in or linked to R&I activities at the sending institution
 - Have the appropriate R&I experience
 - Return to the sending institution
 - Secondment min. 1 month independent to which institution (split stay allowed) “**NEW**”
- Be considered “**staff**” of the sending organisation.
 - Be actively engaged in or linked to R&I activities at the sending institution
 - Have the appropriate R&I experience
 - Return to the sending institution
 - Secondment min. 1 month to the same hosting institution (split stay allowed)

*Researchers are seconded for **minimum 1** and **maximum 12 months**.*

Gender Equality Plan (applicable from 2022 onwards)



Participants that are **public bodies, research organisations or higher education institutions*** established in a Member State or Associated Country **must have a gender equality plan** in place, fulfilling **mandatory process-related requirements**.

** Private-for-profit entities (incl. SMEs), NGOs, CSOs, as well any type of organisations from non-associated third countries, are exempted for the criterion

Closely follow the call requirements

Be in line with the action's objectives and expected outcomes

Follow available guidelines

Use the structure provided in the template and address all the evaluation criteria

Highlight the EU dimension

Show that your proposal addresses EU policy priorities and/or societal challenges

Get a second opinion

Have your proposal proof-read by a colleague and pre-screened by your NCP

Sustainability of collaboration

Describe the benefits of cooperation and how they can go beyond this project

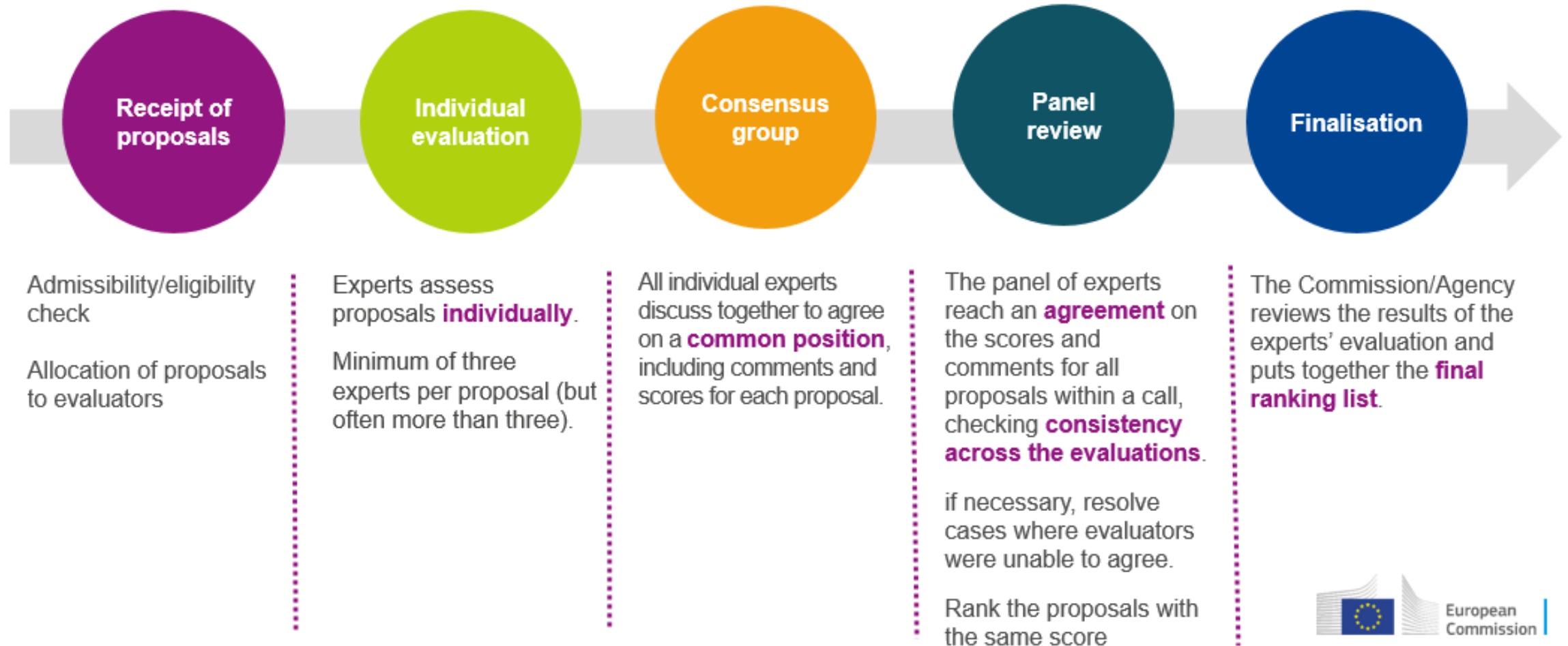

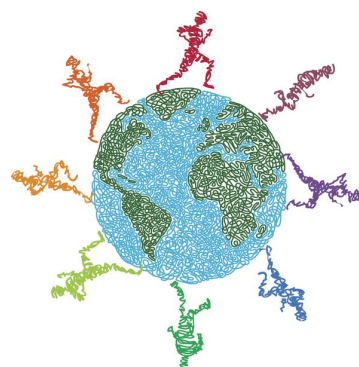
Evaluation criteria

Excellence and **I**mplementation are closely interlinked!

Ex-aequo proposals

The priority order:

1. Scores they have been awarded for the criterion 'Excellence'.
2. When these scores are equal, priority will be based on scores for the criterion 'Impact'.
3. If a distinction still cannot be made, the panel may decide to further prioritise by considering other factors such as:
 - *gender and other diversity aspects in the research activities,*
 - *participation of the non-academic sector (including involvement of SMEs),*
 - *geographical diversity,*
 - *international cooperation,*
 - *favorable working/secondment conditions or relationship to the Horizon Europe objectives in general.*

Evaluation of proposals and Open Science

“Excellence” criterion



“Quality of implementation” criterion

- Up to 1 page to describe OS practices + up to 1 page to describe research data/output management
- Evaluation of the quality of open science practices

- Explain expertise on OS (if no OS practices are involved then no expertise required)
- List publications, software, data, etc, relevant to the project with qualitative assessment (part B2)
- Publications expected to be open access; datasets expected to be FAIR and ‘as open as possible, as closed as necessary’.

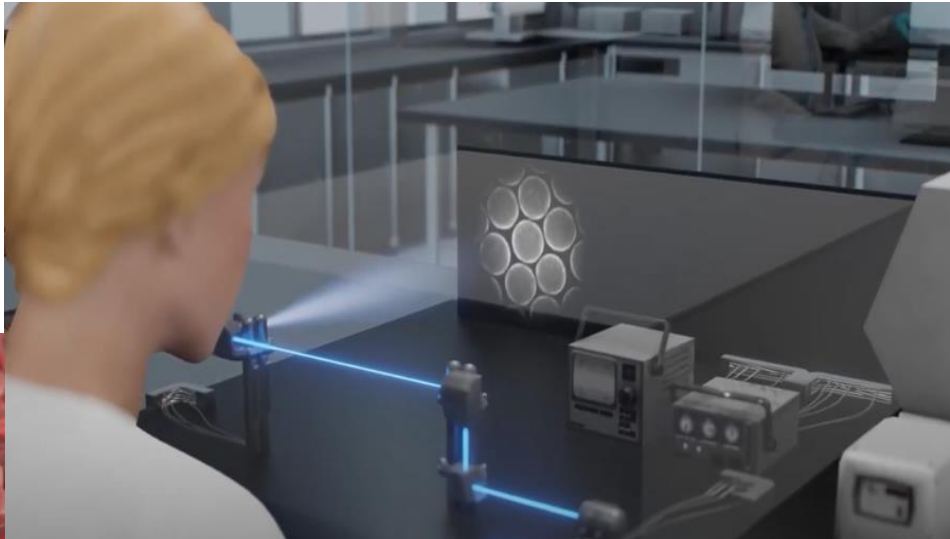
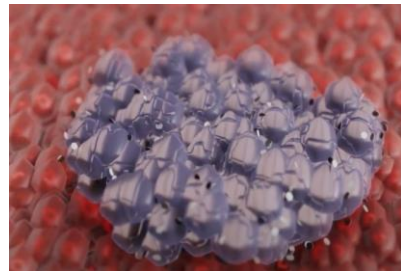
