














Meetings

Achieving Objectives/Delivering impact:




Working group meetings, to coordinate the scientific work, production, and exchange of knowledge

Training schools





- Training Schools serve to help the Action achieve their MoU Objectives and deliver impact.
- They are the tool for transferring know-how among all types of actors and building interdisciplinary expertise
- Intensive coaching opportunities for Action participants, on a topic relevant to the respective COST Action.
- They are typically, although not exclusively, considered to be for the benefit of young researchers.



to disseminate knowledge developed within the Action to targeted groups. to build capacity in highly innovative topics or methods.









Mobility of researchers and innovators



- Short-Term Scientific Mission, visit a host organization located in a different country than the one of affiliation by a Researcher or Innovator for the specific work to be carried out and for a determined period of time.
- Virtual Mobility, collaboration in a virtual setting among researchers or innovators within the COST Action, to perform activities that do not necessarily require in-person presence.








Short-term scientific missions, Virtual mobility grant, to support individual mobility, strengthen existing networks, foster collaboration, to exchange knowledge, to learn new techniques, etc.







Presentations at conferences



- COST promotes the participation of researchers and innovators in external events to the Action.
- Significantly increase visibility of the Action in the research community.
- Attract additional participants and stakeholders and disseminate Action results to relevant end-users.
- Support Young Researchers and Innovators affiliated in a legal entity in an ITC/NNC to establish a strong network and increase their visibility in the research community;






ITC Conference Grants, to support attendance and presentations by Young Researchers from ITC/NNC countries to international external conferences.

Dissemination Grants, to support the attendance of an Action participant to disseminate information about the Action at external events; attract additional stakeholders.

• Scientific discoveries and breakthroughs, development of new research infrastructures, adoption of common standards, technological applications in the form of products and services, etc.



Research careers

• 95% of researchers participating in COST Actions indicate that participation has led to career advancement



Follow-up funding

• Horizon 2020 reported success rate: 37% (on a yearly basis, around €390 million of approved common research projects spin off from ending Actions)



Industry/SME participation

- To find partners for research projects and proposals
- To stay up-to-date with new research
- To exploit new technologies
- To retrieve first-hand information
- To know the key researchers in a specific field
- To increase European/international visibility





Industry/SME participation

For Actions currently active (or just ending) in May 2022:

- ~700 SMEs and ~267 non-SME business are active as MC member or WG member in COST Actions
- 48 Spanish participants from 46 (self-reported) SMEs are active as MC member or WG member, as well as 12 participants from non-SME business.


COST Innovators grant (CIG)



- Launched in November 2019 as a pilot scheme, aiming to build bridges between research and take up at market, product, service, or societal level.
- CIGs offers ending Actions the possibility to create additional impact during one year after the end of the Action
- COST Innovators Grants benefit from the same networking activities available to COST Actions.
- COST Actions are eligible to <u>apply upon invitation</u> by the COST Association towards the end of their lifetime.
- The evaluation of CIG applications takes place once a year in two phases: the first one remotely, followed by virtual or face-to-face hearings for the top ranked applications.

- Travel times


Long distance travel (≥101 km) covers total travel expenses up to 1500 EUR
